The reason for this changed is that each quarter the club posts out the newsletter and walks programme, this incurs the costs of printing the documents, stamps (68p now for 2<sup>nd</sup> class postage) and the cost of the envelopes which are printed off with the club's logo and each individual member's name and address. There is also the time factor of doing this to consider, printing the envelopes then folding and stuffing the documents into envelopes, attaching stamps, and finally physically posting them all out. Currently we have around 100+ members and growing who receive their correspondence via email, the cost to send out emails is nil, and the time taken to do this is negligible.

A possible future development touched on was using card reader machines to collect fares on the Sunday coach, this obviously needs looking into and further discussion.

The annual lunch took place at The Nuneaton Golf Club on Sunday 16<sup>th</sup> of October, which turned out to be a very pleasant dry day ideal for the walks that Richard had planned for us.
